6th Grade - Course Descriptions

Art 1

This semester class is designed to provide an overview of visual arts while studying a variety of art tools and materials. This class is BEGINNER level.

Band 1 - Brass

This beginning band class focuses on the trumpet, horn, trombone, or tuba. Practice and concerts outside of class time and instrument are required. French horns, baritones, and tubas may be rented from the school at a nominal fee.

Band 1 - Percussion

This beginning band class is offered for students who wish to learn mallet percussion instruments such as xylophone and marimba, as well as snare drum and other percussion instruments. Practice and concerts outside of class time are required. Percussion kits consisting of a small xylophone, rubber mallets, practice pad, and snare sticks are also required, and are not available through the school.

Band 1 - Woodwinds

This beginning band class focuses on the flute, oboe, or clarinet. Practice and concerts outside of class time and instrument are required. Saxophone is not offered at the beginning of the year. Students may start on clarinet and audition for saxophone later in the year.

Choir 1

This semester class is open to all students. Emphasis will be placed on quality vocal production, part-singing, and music reading skills. Rehearsals and performances outside of class time are part of the course requirement and will constitute a portion of the grade.

College and Career Awareness (CCA)

College and Career Awareness is a semester exploratory class for 6th grade students. The purpose of this program is to allow students to be involved in activity-centered lessons which utilize technology, develop beginning skills, and explore careers.

Concert Band

Prerequisite: Band 1 or Audition/Interview

This intermediate-level band course increases musical proficiency through performance and study of music. Practice, rehearsals, and concerts outside of class time are part of the course requirement and constitute a portion of the grade. Instrument is required.

Dance 1

This semester course offers instruction on the fundamentals of dance technique, improvisation, and choreography. Students practice a variety of dance styles while learning the elements of dance (body, energy, space, and time.) This class can satisfy the PE requirement, or it can be taken as an elective in addition to the traditional PE class.

FCS 6

This semester class introduces all areas of Family & Consumer Sciences (FCS). We explore basics in Personal Skills (communication, organization, and handling stress), Childcare (preschool and first aid), Sewing (cooling neck wrap and pillowcase), Foods and Nutrition (salsa, soft pretzels, etc.), Interior Design (online designs), and Free Enterprise (shark tank business competition).

Guitar 1

Ability to read the treble clef music staff, or taking 'Choir 1' first, is recommended by the instructor. This semester course introduces learning to play a guitar. Emphasis will be placed on reading music, fundamental technique in the first position, simultaneous singing and playing, and tone production. Practice outside of class time and instruments are required.

Intro to French Language and Culture

This semester class introduces the French language and vocabulary for people and things in everyday life through games, songs, and practice. We also learn about the countries where French is spoken.

Intro to Spanish Language and Culture

In this semester course, you will learn about basic Spanish words and phrases. You will learn about Spanish culture that ties you to a global community of the Spanish-speaking world.

Intro to Speech and Debate

This semester course is designed to introduce students to debate, analysis, reasoning, delivery skills, organization, writing techniques and research. The course provides opportunities for impromptu speaking, original oratory, extemporaneous speaking.

Math Lab

This course is designed for students who have been <u>identified as requiring intensive</u> <u>instruction</u> for Math, focusing on pre-teaching and reviewing math principles and concept mastery.

PE 6

This course is an activity-based course designed to promote student knowledge of and positive disposition toward physical activity, fitness, and nutrition. Students will participate in competitive and cooperative activities. Organized games will promote physical fitness, social interaction, and fun. In addition, students will learn the importance of physical activity and proper nutrition for physical and emotional health.

Orchestra 1

This class focuses on the violin, viola, cello, or string bass. No experience necessary; practice and concerts outside of class time and instrument are required. Violas, cellos, and basses may be rented from the school at a nominal fee.

Orchestra 2

Prerequisite: Instructor approval

This is an intermediate-level orchestra class. Practice, rehearsals, and performances outside of class time are part of the course requirement and will constitute a portion of the grade. Instruments are required.

Reading

This course is designed for students who have been <u>identified as requiring intensive</u> <u>instruction</u> in reading comprehension, vocabulary, and reading skills. This course will focus on intervention reading strategies that will assist striving readers with literary, informational, and functional texts.
